National Motorsport Week celebrates and promotes all forms of motorsport and the community making the sport thrive throughout the UK.

Marked annually, National Motorsport Week provides a call to action for the community to come together under the umbrella of a national event to activate and support the growth and development of motorsport.

The 2024 edition of National Motorsport Week will run from 11 – 21 July, starting with the famous Goodwood Festival of Speed in West Sussex and Extreme E in Scotland, and concluding with the London E-Prix at the ExCel in London.
